Lili'uokalani (1838-1917) was the last sovereign monarch of the Hawaiian Kingdom, reigning from 1891-1893. She was the first Hawaiian to become proficient in writing with Western musical notation, and her song "The Flower of Ko'olau" was one of the first Hawaiian songs to be published on the American mainland. Lili'uokalani also sang, played the piano, organ, and plucked instruments, and was a conductor.
